ffirst I give and bequeath unto my Sister Susanna the Wife of William Jarvis of Wansford in the County of Northampton Yeoman the Annuity or yearly Sum of Twelve Pounds to be paid to her by my Executrix hereafter named during the term of the natural life of my said Sister by four equal quarterly payments in the year the first payment thereof to be made within one month next after my decease And it is my Will and meaning and I do hereby direct all my Estates both real and personal to be subject to the payment of such Annuity or Yearly Sum Also I give and devise unto my Dear Wife Elizabeth Brickwood All and every my Lands Tenements and Hereditaments whatsoever and wheresoever with their and every of their Appurtenances To hold the same to her my said Wife Elizabeth Brickwood and her Heirs and Assigns for ever And I give and bequeath to her my said Wife Elizabeth Brickwood All the rest residue and remainder of my moneys and Securitys for money Goods Chattels Personal Estate and Effects of what nature or kindsoever she paying thereout my Just Debts and ffuneral expences And Lastly I do hereby make constitute and appoint her my said Wife Elizabeth Brickwood Sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament revoking and declaring void all former and other Wills In Witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of January in the twenty third Year of the Reign of King George the third and in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eight three Edwd Brickwood
