This is the last Will and Testament of me Henry Dayrell of Towcester in the County of Northampton a Lieutenant in His Majesty's Royal Navy as follows, that is to say, All that my messuage or tenement orchard and garden heredit and premises thereto belonging situate and being in Padbury in the County of Buckingham now in the Occupation of Robert Porter which I hold under a lease to me granted from All Souls College in Oxford and all my estate right title and interest term and terms of years therein now to come and unexpired and all benefit of renewal thereof I give and bequeath unto my dear wife Mary Dayrell her executors administrators and assigns absolutely to and for her and their own use and benefit I give to my Agent Mr Creed now residing at No Ten Norfolk Street in the Strand London a gold ring and request the favour of him to expedite as much as he can the Payment of the bounty which will be allowed to my Widow All my household and other goods plate linen china pictures ready money and securities for money and all other my Personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever I give to my said wife for her own use and benefit she paying thereout all my just debts funeral and testamentary expences the expences of proving this my Will and of the purchase of the said ring It is my will and desire that there should be room left in my ffather's vault in Lillingstone Dayrellin the said County of Buckingham or in any other which I may erect for my said wife to be buried next to me and I appoint my said wife and my son Richard Dayrell Executrix and Executor of this my Will and hereby revoke all others by me made and declare this alone to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the nineteenth day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eleven Henry Dayrell
